PHNs in APS

- evaluate medical needs/problems that are contributing to the risk to a client's safety
- help client access primary care medical services for medical evaluations and/or treatment
- Work in tandem with SW if necessary to gain access to the client
 - ❖ nurses can get a foot in the door with the offering of a free blood pressure check

PHNs in APS

- advise SW on what they are dealing with medically
- make recommendations on the service plan

PHNs in IHSS

- consultations on medications and impact on functioning and or medication conflicts
- assessing the need for and accessing DME (durable medical equipment)
- specialty case consultation with caregivers
- referrals to specialized medical care

PHNs in IHSS

- accompany social worker on HV to assess need for services based on certain medical conditions
- HV with client to assess need for Paramedical services
- HV with client for re-evaluation of IHSS hours after discharge from hospital
- make appropriate referrals

- Liaison between doctors and social workers

Level of Nursing and

Responsible Agency

- 2 of the surveyed counties use Registered Nurses (RNs) while 13 of the surveyed counties use Public Health Nurses (PHNs)
- Hiring and Supervision was split 50/50 between Social Services Agency and Department of Public Health
